Biography

Yang Yanchao, PhD, is an Associate Professor and Doctoral Supervisor, currently serving as Dean of the Department of Digital and Intelligent Language Services. His main research areas include scale development and psychometrics, applied linguistics, and digital and intelligent educational assessment. He has long focused on the development of measurement instruments in educational and linguistic research, the assessment of learners' psychological characteristics, and digital and intelligent approaches to educational evaluation. He currently serves as Associate Editor of the Journal of Language Service Studies, and as an Editorial Board Member of BMC Psychology, PLOS One, and Scientific Reports. He is also a reviewer for several SSCI-indexed journals. He has published more than 30 papers in SSCI-indexed journals such as Language Teaching Research, Learning and Instruction, and the European Journal of Education, as well as in CSSCI-indexed journals such as Shanghai Journal of Translators. His paper on the development of an academic involution scale was selected as a Wiley Highly Cited Paper in 2023. The provincial first-class blended course English Pronunciation and the provincial quality online open course English Listening, both led by him, were selected among the first batch of

recommended courses for the National Smart Education Platform for Higher Education. He has also led his team to be recognised as a provincial outstanding teaching team and has received more than ten awards in provincial and national teaching competitions. His research combines theoretical construction with methodological application. He is well versed in classical test theory, the Rasch model, network analysis, and related methods, and has developed a systematic body of research in scale development, educational measurement, and digital and intelligent educational assessment.
